Read All About the Upcoming Candidates Forums — and then be sure to attend. Following is a reprint of the article/open letter appearing in the (Friday, Feb. 27) Alexandria Gazette Packet and Alexandria Times: The article is reprinted here for the convenience of ADC Newsletter readers so that you may refer to it throughout the next two months as the dates come up.

“On Tuesday, May 5, 2009 Alexandrians will go to the polls to elect our Mayor and the six members of the Alexandria City Council. Both the Democratic and Republican parties want to ensure that all Alexandrians have the opportunity to interact with the candidates, to ask questions and to express their concerns about City Government.

Together, we have established five Candidates Forums which will be held throughout the City during March and April.

The dates and venues are:

March 18 – Center City Forum – Minnie Howard TC Williams Campus – 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM

March 26 – Social Issues/Non-Profit Organizations – Minnie Howard TC Williams Campus – 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM

April 2 – Business Issues Form – The Westin Alexandria, Carlyle Center – 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM

April 16 – West End City Forum – Francis Hammond Middle School – 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM

April 22 – East End City Forum – George Washington Middle School – 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM

Our hope is that by announcing these Forums early and by giving them the widest publicity possible, we will be able to reach all Alexandrians who want to participate. Every citizen is invited to attend as many of the Forums as they can – the East, West and Center designations are only there to indicate where each Forum is being held. Civic Associations in those areas will be asked to take the lead in helping us to organize the Forums, but everyone should feel welcome to attend any of these events.

We recognize that this is a departure from past election cycles when Forums were sponsored by individual groups or Civic Associations. We believe that this new approach will enable more Alexandrians to feel as if they are included in the election process.

Though we will not schedule any additional Forums, we will consider invitations for “Meet and Greet” events. Groups interested in having informal meetings with all of the candidates should contact both parties to check for available dates. We have agreed that only those events which have been cleared through both parties will be attended by any candidates.

## Electronic Poll Books!

Alexandria is switching to electronic pollbooks beginning with the May 5 City Council and School Board Election. This will save the City quite a bit of money in the long run (since we will need fewer Election Officers to process voters), and eliminate the always-mysterious discrepancy in wait times between alpha-splits of the books. Voters will be able to check in with the next available pollbook officer.

## Absentee Voting

Monday, April 6, at 8:00 a.m., Absentee Voting begins at 132 N. Royal Street. We will have ballots ready and will begin both in-person voting and absentee by mail (including the "permanent" absentee voters) on April 6, 2009.

The office will be open for in-person absentee voting from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, as well as from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday April 25 and Saturday May 2 (which is also the last day for in-person absentee voting). Finally, we will have in-person absentee voting until 7:30 p.m. on the four evenings that we have Election Officer training—currently scheduled for April 20, April 21, April 28, and April 29.

## Reports in brief from the Virginia General Assembly

**State Senator Patsy Ticer reports:** “Our budget looks similar to the way it looked last year, and with the addition of stimulus funds on a one-time basis, local governments now have more time to prepare for the direction in which our economy seems to be heading. There is general understanding that these assistance funds will be available on a one-time basis, and although the stimulus package restores 9 million for economic development, approximately 17 million for public safety and 40 million to help balance the budget at the end of the year, that we must be designing creative responses to the financial crisis in which we and the entire country find ourselves” (More about the budget and other topics at the ADC Meeting and Legislative Wrap-up on Monday, April 6. ) Senator Ticer also reports on several bills out of the Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources Committee. And, she notes, “We have finally approved a bill banning text messaging while driving”.

**Delegate David Englin reports:** While we are wrapping up dozens of bills, finalizing the state's \$77-billion biennial budget is our main piece of unfinished business. I voted in favor of the Senate version of the budget last week, which properly accounts for the latest revenue data showing a \$3.7 billion shortfall and which incorporates Virginia's share of funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. Now budget negotiators from the House and Senate are meeting to hammer out the differences between the two budgets. I am hopeful that we will ultimately deliver a balanced budget that protects core services like education, health care, and public safety, while also making appropriate investments in the economy. Also, The General Assembly passed legislation that I sponsored requiring the State Board of Education to develop guidance to help Virginia schools address the troubling new phenomenon of cyberbullying. (“a number of middle school and high school students explained to me that the real problem they face in our schools is the growing use of new technologies like camera phones, text messaging, blogs, and MySpace for bullying, harassment, and intimidation.” More from Del. Englin on April 6 at the ADC Meeting and Legislative Wrap-up regarding schools now having a choice in testing English proficiency , smoke-free restaurants and more.

**Delegate Charniele Herring reports:** House Bill 2672, which I sponsored, passed the Chamber on a 92 to 6 vote. I am so pleased the bill has passed both chambers and is on its way to the Governor's desk for signature. This bill includes changing the name of the Dept. of Minority Business Enterprise to better reflect the diversity of the population that the Department covers; the agency the programs come under, and a better definition of who qualifies for the department's benefits. I continue to fight for a Rental Assistance Pilot Program. I introduced a floor amendment to the budget last Thursday when the House took up the budget bill. and I fought on the floor to add this program into the budget. The program would have saved the Commonwealth millions of dollars in public services and helped families stay in their homes. Unfortunately the floor amendment failed on a 43 to 56 vote.

I am continuing to work on this issue with the Governor's administration. In this fiscal crisis it is important that we use creative and innovative ideas to help keep people in their homes and keep costs down for Virginia.

## For the Planet

American mailboxes are inundated with junk mail. More than **100,000,000,000** (that's 100 **billion**, folks) pieces of junk mail are delivered each year—that's more than 800 pieces per household. In fact, junk mail in the U.S. accounts for one-third of all the mail delivered in the world. Even though 44% of that mail goes to the landfill unopened, we still spend 8 months of our lives dealing with it all. It would take the equivalent of over 500,000 garbage truck loads to dump all junk mail into landfills and incinerators each year.



By the year 2010, almost 50% of the solid mass that makes up our landfills is expected to be paper and paperboard waste.

State and local governments and their citizens spend hundreds of millions of dollars per year to collect and dispose of all the bulk mail that does not get recycled.

6.5 million tons of discounted junk mail entered the U.S. municipal solid waste stream in 2006—this includes streams in our own neighborhoods.

Greenhouse gases created each year by junk mail is equivalent to running 11 coal-fired power plants!

Greendimes plants 10 trees when you sign up and 41pounds.org donates one-third of your fee to non-profit environmental groups listed on their site.

### Charles Houston Recreation Center

Much has been written about the dedication of this building on February 21, when Mayor Euille gave his State of the City address there, the Center was dedicated, and the public toured the beautiful, multi-functional facility.

It is named for attorney Charles Houston who was a leader in the civil rights movement locally and nationally. He worked to bring the Parker Gray School to the 900 block of Wythe St. and later to get the Parker Gray High School built. He was Dean of the Howard University School of Law. Attorney Houston is known as, "the man who killed Jim Crow," because he authored a legal brief used by his protégé, Thurgood Marshall, to win Brown vs. the Topeka Board of Education, the U.S. Supreme Court case that helped to end racial segregation in American schools.

There is one more noteworthy fact about the Center that hasn't yet been mentioned — it is in Precinct 109! We residents are pleased and proud of the new facility and what it stands for.
