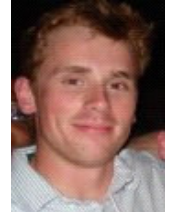

We live in Virginia; where we helped make that possible with our first vote for a Democratic President in more than 40 years, and where; if we do everything we know we must, the leadership of former Governors Warner and Kaine will be followed by that of Governor Deeds.

EDUCATION

Creigh Deeds stood with Mark Warner to pass the single largest education investment in Virginia history and is

committed to fully funding public education in every budget as Governor while his opponent McDonnell voted against Mark Warner's investment and recently proposed a transportation plan that would drain \$5.41 billion from education and other core priorities over ten years. In 2008, Creigh fought for \$122 million in funds for pre-kindergarten programs. This initial investment in pre-k represents the beginning of a long-term commitment to starting our children off on the right track. He also authored legislation requiring our teachers' salaries be at least the national average.

JOBS:

Creigh Deeds wrote the law that created the modern-day Governor's Opportunity Fund, which helped create over 78,000 jobs, and has been called the most successful jobs program in Virginia history. His opponent McDonnell voted against the Governor's Opportunity Fund three times, slashing \$16 million in funding despite knowing the program helped create jobs.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

Creigh Deeds has been a long-time champion of economic development. Since 1995, he fought for legislation to lower the Virginia Business Facility Tax Credit from a 100-job threshold to 50 jobs and 25 in economically distressed areas. The program provides firms that create new full-time jobs with a tax credit of \$1,000 for every job over the threshold. Senator Deeds has also sponsored legislation designed to make Virginia a better place to do business for green energy companies, including tax exemptions for wind and solar projects and changes to the state code that would allow consumers and small businesses to sell back more of their renewable energy to utilities.

Finally, for those of us who started out as Brian Moran supporters, the most important thing we can do for Brian's legacy is to help our party keep the Governor's mansion and take back the House of Delegates.

There are two—soon to be three— great field organizers from the Coordinated Campaign (for Creigh Deeds/Jody Wagner/Steve Shannon) here in Alexandria to help us and work with us. When they call you, say "YES" and find at least 4 hours between now and November to help. If everyone reading this gives 4 hours, our candidates would gain 10,000 volunteer hours. If we keep doing what we do best; that is, organizing and staying true to our values, **we will elect Creigh Deeds as our next Governor, Jody Wagner as our next Lieutenant Governor, and Steve Shannon as our next Attorney General.**

For the Planet

BURN, BABY, BURN - or - Walking: Good for you; Good for the Planet

The more we drive, the greater our carbon impact. Close to 30% of the greenhouse gases released in the U.S. come from transportation. Of that amount, over 80% is produced by vehicles driving on the roads (cars, trucks, buses) and burning gasoline or diesel.

In the 1990s, greenhouse gas emissions from American automobiles **increased** almost 20%. And that trend continues in this decade. Car ownership is up; vehicle occupancy is down. Carpooling and the number of people who walk instead of driving has **dropped by half** since 1980. People are making more trips in their cars and commuting farther. And unfortunately the average fuel efficiency of passenger cars, including small trucks and SUVs, has actually decreased over the last 20 years.

Each gallon of gasoline burned in an average car's engine blows 19.4 pounds of CO₂ out the exhaust and directly into Earth's atmosphere. With a gas tank size of 15 to 18 gallons, that's an incredible 350 pounds of CO₂ released each time you use a tank of gas.

Ditch the car and walk: Prevention Magazine rates Alexandria as one of the top walkable cities in the country. Alexandria is accessible by metro, bike paths and you can even take the free trolley that runs up and down King Street from the metro to the Torpedo Factory Arts Center near the river. Leave the 2,000 pound car at home and walk for a while – you'll lose even more! A 180-pound person can burn about 100 calories just walking at a two-mile per hour pace. A few more reasons to love walking and walkers: *Walking doesn't give children asthma; *Walkers don't harm other people if they accidentally bump into them; *Our nation doesn't need to maintain an army halfway around the world to enable walkers to walk; *Walkers improve public safety by populating the streets; *Walkers are not heavily subsidized by the general taxpayer; *Walking improves health and fitness and reduces overall medical and medical insurance costs.

Registering to Vote...Absentee Voting...Polling Place

Voter Registration Deadline

The deadline for registering to vote in this November's election is 5 p.m. on Monday, October 5. Applications are available at the Voter Registration Office, DMV Centers, City Hall, and Alexandria Libraries. Upon request, registration applications will be mailed or faxed. You may also download an application at AlexandriaVoter.org.

Absentee Voting

Absentee voting for this November's election begins on Friday, September 18.

For absentee-voting by mail, the Office of Voter Registration and Elections must have received your application for an absentee ballot by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, October 27. The ballot itself must be received at the Registrar's Office by the close of polls on Tuesday November 3, 7 p.m. *An absentee ballot dropped off (rather than mailed), must be delivered personally by the voter.*

For in-person absentee voting, the Registrar's Office will be open Monday - Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., September 18 through October 30. In addition, the Office will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, October 3, 24, and 31. The deadline for in-person absentee voting is Saturday, October 31 at 5 p.m.

The Ballot will include the Offices of Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Virginia House of Delegates, Alexandria Commonwealth's Attorney, and Sheriff.

Polling Place Change

Effective with the November 3, 2009, General Election, the St. Martin Senior Center polling place (4650 Taney Avenue) will move to the Patrick Henry Recreation Center which is located across the street at 4643 Taney Avenue.

The Electoral Board recommended this change, and City Council authorized the move, because State law requires that, "each polling place shall be located in a public building whenever practicable (Code of Virginia: Section 24.2-310)." In addition, the gymnasium at Patrick Henry will provide more space for voters and voting equipment, which is especially important during large elections.

Patrick Henry was a polling place until a move to St. Martin was required in early 2004 because of planned construction at the center. All of the voters in this precinct will be mailed a notification about the move, the change will be advertised in the local newspaper, and signs will also be posted at St. Martin in November to direct voters across the street to Patrick Henry.
