## You did it again—a clean sweep—now onto to November

You – and our talented candidates – did it again! They could not have done it without you. If it needed to be done to help reelect **Mayor Bill Euille and Council Members Ludwig Gaines, Rob Krupicka, Andrew Macdonald, Del Pepper and Paul Smedberg** and to elect **Tim Lovain**, you went out and did it. From the caucus in February through Election Day in May, the number of volunteer hours you put in was prodigious.

The voters sent a VERY strong message to those who

think that they will swallow (hook, line and sinker) the fallacy that excellent government services can be magically maintained without paying for them. Time after time at the candidates' Forums, one of the opposition candidates would spout the "3% cap" line, then at the next question advocate initiating some new costly program.

In November, we anticipate that voters around the country will send the same message to Congressional Republicans. That message needs to start

here in Virginia, with the defeat of the incumbent US Senator and the reelection of Congressman **Jim Moran**. Whether you support **Harris Miller** or **Jim Webb** for Senate, please get out and work for your choice in the waning days of the primary campaign. ## The spiritual left is organizing for social action

Over the past ten years, the religious right has usurped religious language and media attention, claiming that their view of religion with an authoritarian God and dogmatic doctrine is the only religious way. They have tapped into the unmet spiritual need of Americans and recruited thousands to their fundamentalist churches which are also supporting the Political Right.

As reported in the May 20th Washington Post and witnessed in the recent Conference on Spiritual Activism at the All Souls Unitarian Church May 17- 20, the religious left is finally finding its own voice and developing a strength of its own.

Spiritual activism is political and social action that is based on universal values of love, justice, freedom, humility, transcendence of ego and on the affirmation of pleasure, playfulness, humor, sensual aliveness and compassion for all life.

The Conference on Spiritual Activism was hosted by the Network of Spiritual Progressives (NSP) ([www.spiritualprogressives.org](http://www.spiritualprogressives.org)). NSP is a network of different organized faiths as well as individuals who consider themselves "Spiritual but not Religious." Speakers at the conference included Rev, Jim Wallis, Matthew Fox and Rabbi Michael Lerner, author of *The Left Hand of God*, Taking Back our

Country from the Religious Right and one of the co-chairs of NSP.

In *The Left Hand of God*, Lerner argues that the Democratic Party must champion a progressive spiritual vision, reject the old bottom line that promotes the globalization of selfishness and deal head-on with the spiritual crisis that many Americans experience every day.

## Democratic candidates sweep City Council elections

Alexandria's incumbent Mayor and all six Democrat nominees were elected to City Council May 2nd in a clean sweep of City Hall, the second time the entire Democrat slate was elected in as many elections.

Turnout and the election results indicate residents are pleased with Democratic stewardship of the City. This is despite the barrage of negative messages from opponents who tried to use the City's open budget process and tough decisions made by the sitting Council as a battering ram.

Mayor William D. "Bill" Euille received 92% of the vote. Republicans chose not to nominate an opponent against the

popular mayor and instead invested their efforts into securing a City Council seat.

The five Democrat incumbents — Ludwig Gaines, Rob Krupicka, Andrew Macdonald, Del Pepper and Paul Smedberg — along with first-time nominee Tim Lovain, ran strong in every precinct, including the most Republican-leaning ones.

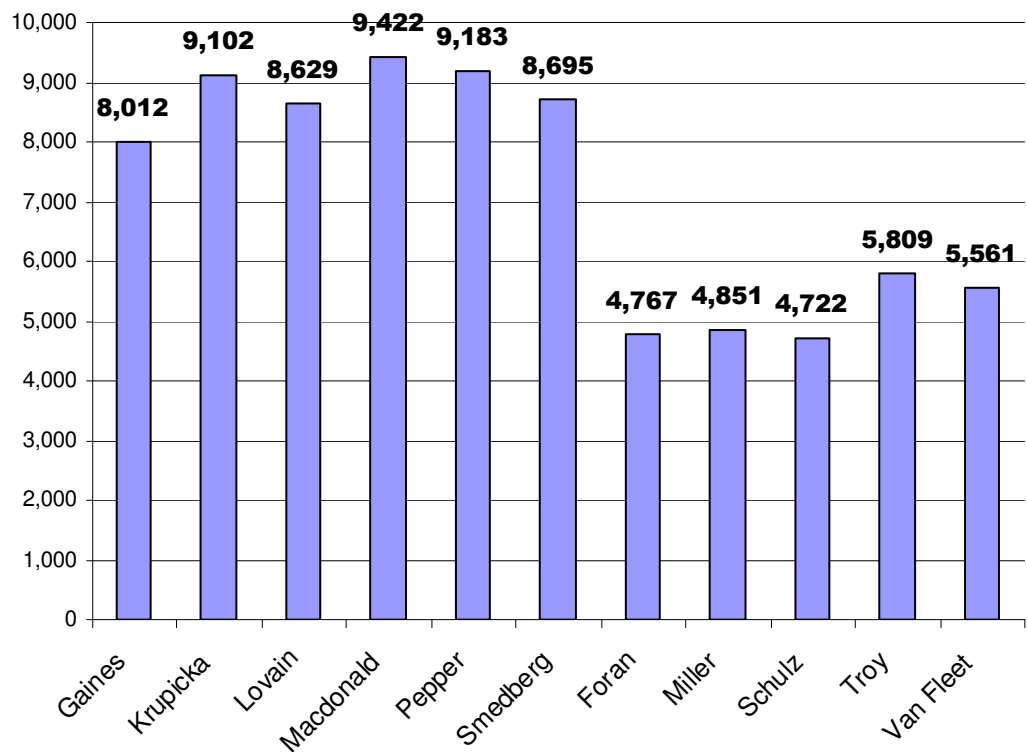
When you compare results from past elections you notice reliable Republican votes dropping in the precincts where they should be strong. This indicates that those voters are staying home or switching their support to Democrats. Why this is happening is open to interpretation but few would argue that the low poll numbers for

Bush and Republican-led Congress are the top driver.

Governor Kaine's successful campaign experienced significant support in traditionally Republican precincts in Alexandria, not to mention statewide. Democrats have captured every special election since Kaine was elected. Support for an all Democrat City Council appears to indicate the effect extends down to the local level.

Turnout was just under 20% of registered voters, which is five percent lower than in 2003. The large number of incumbents, a satisfied electorate and the lack of any serious Republican challengers are the likely caused the low turnout.

## Commonwealth Coalition battles anti-gay amendment

The ADC Book Club will meet at its regular time, 8:00 p.m., at La Madeleine, 500 King Street,

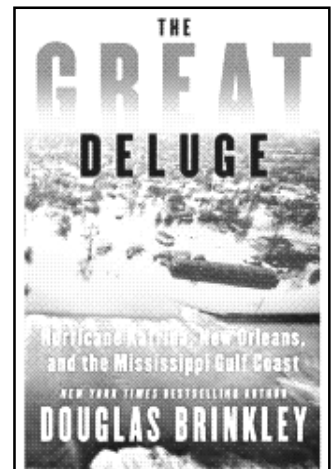
