Republicans continually confirm they can't govern

The General Assembly still has a long way to go to develop a comprehensive transportation plan. Democrats are working towards a plan that includes new sources of revenue that are stable and reliable, will fully fund critical projects and will not draw on General Fund money. Funding for schools and police officers should not have to compete with money for transportation. In addition, building new roads alone will not fix Virginia's transportation problems; we must focus on

sensible growth policies that link new development with better planning.

The need for 51 House Democrats is obvious. The House Republicans have once again adopted their reactionary, extremist positions. They engaged in mean-spirited politics by rejecting the appointment of one of their own long-time delegates Jim Dillard to the College of William and Mary Board of Visitors. They are rebuking Virginia's long tradition of observing a Governor's preroga-

tive for appointments by rejecting AFL-CIO president Danny LeBlanc. Finally, they are engaging in a short-term, reckless fiscal policy by increasing debt and raiding school and public safety funding. They continue to confirm our assertion that they are incapable of responsible leadership and governance.
