Alexandria campaign staff win weekly Big Dog award

Member calls for more engagement on issues

Perhaps thirty minutes of each meeting might be devoted to an important issue – brief presentations and then open discussion. Regular meetings and publicized agendas for the

resolutions committee might minimize the take-it-or-leave-it approaches to important questions. An effort to educate newer members on the decision-making processes would keep questions from slowing down our meetings.

Kaine gains 10-points to take a slight lead

According to the Washington Post, there has been a 10-point swing in the race over the past seven weeks, giving Tim a slight lead in what is still considered a very close race.

This poll is great news and confirms our momentum in the final days of the campaign.

But despite all of the good news out of this poll and the numerous others that show our momentum in recent days, I urge you not to get complacent. With nine days left, one thing is absolutely clear - this is an extremely close race, and will come down to the wire.

However, every poll we've seen so far shows that the more Virginians hear Tim Kaine's message of keeping Virginia moving forward, the better we do.

Look at some of the findings of the Washington Post poll.

Virginians are happy with the direction that the Warner-Kaine Administration has taken the state. 70% of Virginians believe that the state is on the right track. 80% of Virginians approve of the job Governor Warner is doing, as opposed to only 44% approving of the job President Bush is doing.

Jerry Kilgore's negative attacks have backfired. Two-thirds say Kilgore has conducted a negative campaign. 55 percent believe Kilgore would "say anything" to get elected, and less than half believe that he is "honest in his political dealings." Nearly half of voters have an unfavorable view of him.

"Voters overwhelmingly say [Kilgore's negative death penalty attack] ads were unfair, and they blame Kilgore for launching mean-spirited attacks." Nearly two-thirds of voters say the ads were unfair. 68% of voters believe Tim Kaine will enforce the death penalty, up from 65% before the ads ran.

Tim Kaine is viewed as running an honest and positive campaign. "Kaine is seen by a majority of voters as having run an honest, straightforward campaign. Sixty percent say he has been 'honest in his political dealings' and fewer than half believe he would 'say anything' to get elected."

Close to 60 percent say they think he is running a positive campaign, and nearly 60% have a favorable view of him.

Tim Kaine has an overwhelming lead among independent voters. Kaine leads Kilgore among independents 52-33. Nearly 75% of independents believe Kaine will enforce the death penalty, indicating yet again that Kilgore's negative ads backfired.

More than half of independent voters say Bush's support for Kilgore makes them less likely to vote for the Republican candidate.

Tim Kaine is the clear leader on the most important issue in the state - public education. Improving education is the most important issue in the minds of voters. 70% of voters agree that Tim Kaine will improve public education - a nearly twenty point advantage over Jerry Kilgore.

Tim Kaine is running a strong campaign in every region of the state.

Kaine leads Kilgore in Northern Virginia 53-38. In the traditionally Republican-leaning outer Northern Virginia suburbs (western Fairfax, Loudoun and

Prince William counties), Kaine leads 48-42.

In the traditionally Republican Shenandoah Valley, Kaine trails by 2 points (43-45) - a statistical dead heat.

In Jerry Kilgore's home region of Southwest Virginia, Kaine leads by 5 points (48-43).

In traditionally Republican Central Virginia, Kaine trails by 2 points (47-49) - a statistical dead heat.

In Hampton Roads, Kaine

and Kilgore are in a statistical dead heat (42-44).

And in Republican-leaning Southside Virginia, Kaine is within striking distance, trailing 44-48.

These results, along with slight leads in Rasmussen and Survey USA polls and a dead heat in the most recent Mason Dixon poll, show just how close this race is.

In an Associated Press story on the poll, "Kilgore campaign manager Ken Hutcheson expressed 'contempt' for the poll... Hutcheson accused the Post of having 'its agenda when it comes to characterizing the numbers and their impression of this race, but we stand firm by the ads we have run as factual, fair and informative.'

With your help and hard work over the next nine days, we will show that Tim Kaine's positive message of keeping Virginia moving forward will be more successful than Jerry Kilgore's slash and burn campaign tactics.

Kaine's *Strong Start* program will pay huge dividends

In Alexandria, Virginia, almost fifty percent of children show up to kindergarten without any preschool-like experiences. Anecdotal and hard data tell us the kids without pre-kindergarten have a harder time in school. We all know the parable about teaching a man to fish. Well, pre-school is fishing 101. Any child not given the best chance represents a failure for all of us. Fifty percent not given that chance, when we know we could do better, is unconscionable.

As the parent of a three-year-old and a one-year-old, I am deeply impressed by **Tim Kaine's** "Strong Start" plan for universal four-year-old pre-kindergarten. Not only does it demonstrate he cares deeply about my children and those of every Virginia family, it shows that Kaine's focus is on the long-term success of our state and our children. Kaine could have ignored the years of early education research and just said it costs too much. But he didn't do that. He studied the facts, thought about the kids of Virginia and put the future of our state first.

The Strong Start plan says a lot about how Kaine would govern. Kaine's plan asks each community to help craft the approaches that make the most sense for them. And it does not mandate pre-kindergarten or set up a government-only system; it strengthens the existing network of public and private providers, including churches and local co-ops, and leaves

choices in the hands of parents. As a parent, this gives me great confidence in his priorities and governing style.

Reams of research about brain development conclude that pre-kindergarten makes sense. Most of the brain's foundation for learning develops before the age of five. If we don't ensure children have the proper foundation, we are shortchanging them before they even walk into an elementary school.

Even without all the studies, many parents intuitively know all of this. We see how fast our children learn; how they surprise us with new words, phrases and ideas. And many of us have seen kids interact with children of the same age who have not had access to the same amount of reading or brain stimulation. We know children who don't know a few basic letters or colors, or that can't identify a frog or turtle. More and more research says that the brain learns how to sort and organize information by the age of five. For parents, it doesn't take over forty years of research to know that, we see it happening every day.

Unfortunately, many children are left behind. Many families don't have access to pre-K. Head Start serves the very poor. However, the low-income requirements and marginalized funding for Head Start mean many families can't use it. While higher income families often provide pre-school experiences for their children, there is a large group in the middle that

has very few options.

Every child should have access to the best education and the greatest opportunity to succeed. If we truly want every child to meet the annually increasing testing requirements of No Child Left Behind or to meet Virginia's standards of learning, we have to embrace pre-K education for everybody.

Over the long-term, pre-K will save us money. Multiple studies show that dollars invested in pre-kindergarten save many, many more government dollars later as these children are less likely to get into trouble or require government services. In addition, pre-k strengthens the economy by expanding the number of highly qualified employees. All of this is why business leaders, police officers, juvenile court judges, economists and even the Federal Reserve talk about the value of early education programs.

Kaine's proposal represents the type of long-term, strategic choice I wish we were called to make more often. Given how easy it is for campaigns to focus on the short-term during gubernatorial races, Kaine's plan for long-term educational success is nothing, if not bold. Kaine has spelled out a plan for the long-term competitiveness and fiscal strength of Virginia. With his compassion for our children and optimistic plan for their future success, Kaine has demonstrated his ability to lead.

Book club reads “Good Muslim, Bad Muslim...”

November's book is “Good Muslim, Bad Muslim: America, the Cold War, and the Roots of Terror” by Mahmood Mamdani

In this brilliant look at the rise of political Islam, the distinguished political scientist and anthropologist Mahmood Mamdani brings his expertise and

insight to bear on a question many Americans have been asking since 9/11: how did this happen?

Osama bin Laden's pronouncements are rarely published in full in the United States, but transcripts of his messages-often available overseas-provide startling insight into the political, rather than religious, nature of his thinking. “Labeling us, and our acts, as terrorism is also a description of you and your acts,” bin Laden said recently. “Our acts are a reaction to your acts.”

In this meandering rumination on modern-day terrorism, Mamdani takes a controversial

step by agreeing with bin Laden, at least on this point; he argues that groups like al-Qaeda are generally motivated by legitimate political grievances with U.S. foreign policy. “In a nutshell,” Mamdani writes, “the U.S. government decided to harness and even to cultivate terrorists” during the latter half of the Cold War as it sought to roll back the Soviet Union's global influence. Now, with that legacy coming back to haunt its creators, Mamdani concludes that “no Chinese wall divides ‘our’ terrorism from ‘their’ terrorism. Each tends to feed the other.”
